Walk 'n Mass Summer Strolls - Charlotte Temple

As crocuses, tulips and daffodils begin to appear in New England, can the easy and relaxed evenings of summer be far behind? For the third year, Walk 'n Mass is preparing to enjoy these relaxed summer evenings with its summer walking program, the popular Summer Strolls series. The Summer Strolls are group walks of the club's seasonal and year round events and are held every Tuesday. Though the snow lingered especially long this year, the peonies came up rapidly with the early hot weather and are budding now. In two to three weeks they should be at peak bloom. If you have never seen the peonies at Gilsland Farm, the headquarters of Maine Audubon, you are in for a treat. Remnants of the original flowers planted and raised by David Moulton, Portland lawyer and gentleman farmer have regenerated from pieces of rootstock and grow and bloom in the fields and beds at the sanctuary. It is a spectacular sight. The Walk 'n Eat group are planning a walk and picnic on June 14th.

Second, the AVA will be setting its course for the second twenty-five years of volkssporting in the U.S.A. I wish all of you could be there to join in these historic events. But for those who cannot, we wish you a happy volkssport twenty-fifth birthday and look forward to working with you as we build the future of volkssporting in the United States. Thank you for all of the help you have already given us in renewing The Spirit of Walking.

### **FIRST MAINE 'COUNTY WALK' COMPLETED**

**Washington County has now been walked! The May 19 walk in Calais was the first of the designated walks that will entitle participants to receive 'county credit' for walking in the counties of Maine. But where were all those people who thought walking the counties would be a fun deal?**

**In spite of the weather - fog, rain, and wind - forty-three walking enthusiasts were on hand to walk Wandering Maine-iacs Calais, Maine, event. A large contingent of New Hampshire and Massachusetts's walkers were on hand; about half the participants were Canadians, as the Oromocto (New Brunswick) Volksmarch Club held a companion walk across the river in St. Stephen, New Brunswick. Although the walks were in two countries, the start point of either walk could be seen from the other start point across the river. These two events had walking routes that crossed bridges into the neighboring country and return. They were truly 'international walks.'**

**Aside from the weather - the day before was a gorgeous day - the only disappointment about the walk was the lack of participation (and thus support) from local volkssporters. Where were all those people who voted to institute the 'Walking the Counties of Maine' program? How can we continue to offer unique walks, such as the Calais walk, if we don't have enough registrations to pay the bills? How much longer can we continue our activity if every time we hold an event we lost money? The time has come, ladies and gentlemen, that we must 'put up or shut up.'**

START/FINISH: Access Road right of Union Congregational Church of Madbury Town Hall Road Madbury, New Hampshire 03820. TRAIL DESCRIPTION: The 10k walk will mostly be on wood trails behind the Moharimet Elementary School and Kingman Farm, 334 acres of land owned by the University of New Hampshire since 1961. The 5km trail will walk the wood trails behind Moharimet Elementary. Each route will take walkers through Madbury Days activities. The trail is rated 1+ if no rain, 2+ if rain since there are a few hills in Kingman Farm. DIRECTIONS: From I 95 (Exit 4 from Massachusetts, Exit 5 from Maine) onto Route 4, 16 and the Spaulding Turnpike (Toll Road). Take Exit 8W onto Route 9, 155 West. Go through traffic lights continuing on Route 155 West. After crossing the Railroad Bridge and passing by greenhouse on left turn right onto Town Hall Road (ballfields on corner). Start point is on your left after church.

**JUNE 16 -SATURDAY** - SOUTHERN MAINE VOLKSSPORT ASSOCIATION - DOWNEAST WEEKEND 2 - SOUTHWEST HARBOR. Contact Barbara Weymouth (207) 288-5216. - A Maine County Walk - Hancock County. Start/Finish Noon -3:00 PM    Finish Time: by 5:30 PM. Start/Finish Location: Municipal parking lot, Main Street, Southwest Harbor. Description: The 10km walks with a 5km option, will take you through Southwest Harbor on the "quiet side" of Mount Desert Island. The community of SW relies on the sea to maintain its year round population of 2000+ residents. In addition to fishing, lobstering and boat building, there is a US Coast Guard Base and the Oceanarium. Part of the walk will be across a causeway that links the local golf course to "downtown" Southwest. Trail rating is 1+. The causeway is not suitable for wheelchairs, strollers or unleashed dogs. There will be an alternative route for those uncomfortable with crossing at the causeway. Try to come to SW early to visit the Wendall Gilley Museum and the much-photographed Bass Harbor lighthouse. RV parking: will be available (for a limited number of vehicles) behind the police station. Regular parking will be in front of the station and at BH Banking & Trust.

Directions: From Augusta, Take Rt. 3 all the way to Mount Desert Island. From Bangor, take 1A to Ellsworth and Rt. 3 to MDI. At the traffic light at the head of the Island, take Rt. 102S 10 ½ miles to Southwest. Registration will be at the Municipal Parking Lot, first right after the Bar Harbor Banking and Trust Co.

Start/Finish: **THIS IS NOT A TYPO --- 3:00 - 3:30 AM** Finish Time: by 7:00 AM. Start/Finish Location: Overflow parking lot, Kebo Valley Golf Course, Eagle Lake Road, Bar Harbor. Course Description: This 10km walk will take you along the paved road up to the summit of Cadillac Mountain in time to be the first on the East Coast to see sunrise (weather permitting). Rating 2 (the road is paved, but no sidewalks, and uphill). Because of limited parking at the base of the mountain, car-pooling is recommended from Kebo. Not only is it darkest before the dawn (Bring flashlights), it's coldest (dress warmly) Sunrise is at 4:43 A.M. Directions: From Southwest Harbor, take 102N to Somesville, turn right at the traffic light (Rt. 198.) Take a left at Rt.233 for 5 miles to Cromwell Harbor Road on the right.

Kebo Valley Club House will be on your left—parking will be on your right. From Bar Harbor, take Rt. 3 to Rt. 233. Kebo will be .7 miles on your left (at top of hill.)

Directions: This walk is scheduled to coincide with the 'Sunset – Sunrise' walks being held in Bar Harbor on this weekend. You can easily walk SMVA's Sunrise event at Cadillac Mountain and get to Belfast to walk Waldo County. Belfast is about a one hour drive from Bar Harbor, and our start time is scheduled late to accommodate walkers who wish to do both events. DIRECTIONS: From the South and West, take the interstate to Augusta, and then follow Route 3 to Belfast. From the North, follow Routes 1A and 1 south to Belfast. From Bar Harbor, follow Route 3 west to Belfast. Note: From Ellsworth to Belfast, Routes 1 and 3 is a common highway. At the junction of Route 1 (goes south) and Route 3 (goes west), follow Belmont Avenue into Belfast (if you are coming from Bar Harbor, turn left; if you are coming from Augusta, continue straight; if you are coming on Route 1 from the south, turn right). Proceed to Kallis Ford Chrysler, about 1/4 mile on the right.

**SEPTEMBER 29 (SATURDAY) and SEPTEMBER 30 (SUNDAY) Fall Weekend At Norlands Living History Center - Livermore, ME.** [SEE MAY NEWSLETTER FOR ALL THE DETAILS] Start 9 - 11 AM, Finish by 3 PM- Walk either Saturday or Sunday - one day only/one credit only. Bike either Saturday or Sunday - one day only/one credit only. Swim Saturday September 29<sup>th</sup>, Swim NE01/245 (USM - Farmington)- a Maine County Walk - Androscoggin County.

**OCTOBER 6 (SATURDAY) Kittery, Maine** - incorporated in the Province of Maine in 1649. The trail includes Kittery's Portsmouth Naval Shipyard, established in 1800. The Shipyard has played a major role in U.S. naval history since the 74 gun warship U.S.S. Washington was launched there in 1815. Start/Finish: Kittery Community Center Cole Street Kittery, Maine Start Time: 8 a.m. to Noon. Finish Time: All participants must finish by 3 p.m. Trail Description: The trail features the oldest town in Maine. You will stroll among the pine and oak trees of Rogers Park on the shores of Spruce Creek, passing historic homes and "Champion", Maine's largest "cork elm." Highlight of the walk is the Shipyard with its Marine Barracks and Commander's Quarters (built in 1814); U.S.S. Squalus/Sailfish Memorial; the imposing Naval Prison; and Building 86 where the Russo Japanese War peace treaty was signed. **CAMERAS ARE NOT ALLOWED IN THE SHIPYARD.** 5 and 10 km trails will be available. The AVA trail rating is 1+ (easy). Some areas are not suitable for wheelchairs and strollers but alternative routes will be available. Pets are not allowed in the shipyard **and Portsmouth, NH.** The Seacoast Striders invite you to enjoy a walk along the New Hampshire seacoast to view Portsmouth harbor. Portsmouth is the 3rd oldest city (settle in 1623) and a major seaport in New Hampshire. Portsmouth is home to many historical buildings from John Paul Jones house to the old houses in the Strawberry Banke Museum. The Treaty of Portsmouth, ending the Russo Japanese War, was signed here in 1905 Start/Finish: J.F.K. Recreation Center 175 Parrott Avenue Portsmouth, NH 03801 Start Time: 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Finish Time: All participants must finish by 4 p.m. Trail Description: The trails will walk along Portsmouth harbor where you will see views of the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard with a spectacular view of the harbor from the Memorial Bridge (celebrating its 77th year as a major connection between Kittery, ME and Portsmouth). Along the route you will see old historical houses, Portsmouth harbor, Prescott Park and the U.S.S. Albacore. 5 and 10 km trails will be available. The AVA trail rating is 1+ (easy). The trail is suitable for strollers and wheelchairs. **AND OCTOBER 7 (SUNDAY)**

**Gloucester, MA.** This is the much-anticipated TRI- STATE WEEKEND. Bookmark: Brochures have been printed and mailed to each club member. Be sure to make reservations early. This is Columbus Weekend and also leaf-peeping time.
